# Make Your Plans To Attend The Sth Annual SD BAT FESTIVAL

It's that time of year again...the SD Bat Festival will be held on **Saturday, August 17th at Custer State Park's Tatanka Theater** (located next to the Game Lodge Campground). The SD Bat Working Group sponsors this annual celebration of bats and their contributions to healthy ecosystems around the world.

The Festival provides the public an opportunity to learn more about these important animals and have a good time in the process. There are presentations about bats and the conservation work being conducted here in SD and around the world.

The Festival is free and there is something for all ages. (Please Note: The Park does charge an entry fee.)

The Festival begins at 5pm with a formal presentation beginning at 7pm. Bats usually begin to show-up 30 minutes either side of sunset (occurring approx. 8pm on the day of the Festival).

One of the highlights is getting to watch and hear bats flying around the Festival location once the sun sets. Detectors provide Festival-goers the opportunity to hear the echolocation calls of the bats as they forage for insects.

A variety of displays pertaining to bats will be exhibited, including equipment used to study them. Crafts for kids of all ages and free refreshments...including the ever popular homemade bat cookies.

(No bats are harmed in making of the cookies.)



### **NEW BAT GENUS IDENTIFIED**

Recently, a new genus of bat was identified from surveys conducted in South Sudan. The surveys were conducted by Dr. DeeAnn Reeder, Associate Professor of Biology at Bucknell University, with personnel from the South Sudanese Ministry of Wildlife Conservation and Tourism, and Fauna & Flora International (FFI) Programme. The new name is *Niumbaha superba. Niumbaha*, meaning "rare "or " unsusal" is in the local language from the area in which the bat was found. The description appears in the following publication:










### **Echoes From South Dakota**




Gaze deeply into the circle above and repeat the following continuously for as long as it takes or until you realize you're just wasting time.....




